

Johns Hopkins University Emergency Response Unit Standard Operating Guidelines: Respiratory Plan

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Respiratory Protection Protocol: Health, Safety, and Environmental Protection for Airborne Infectious Agents and Aerosolized Hazardous Drugs Protocols

## **Policy**

1. The Johns Hopkins Emergency Response Organization (HERO) will provide Respiratory Protection Devices, specifically N-95 masks, for use of on-call membership who may be exposed to airborne or aerosolized infectious agents or drugs.

## Responsibilities

- 1. It will be the responsibility of the Equipment Officer to ensure that proper N-95 masks are properly stocked and available for all on-scene crews.
- 2. It will be the responsibility of the Training Officer and any dedicated Fit Testing Trainers to ensure the membership is properly trained and fitted for N-95 masks annually and upon becoming an active member on HERO.
- 3. It will be the responsibility of the Personnel officer to maintain records of all members who have been fit tested.
- 4. It will be the responsibility of the membership to ensure he/she is aware of the proper N-95 mask, fitted by a designated Fit Testing Trainer.

## **General Information**

1. All active membership must be fit-tested at least annually with an N-95 respirator.

## **Education and Training**

- 1. It will be the responsibility of the Training Officer to ensure all active members on HERO are properly trained and are aware of when to use N-95 masks.
- 2. For all members, information on the use of respiratory protection will be incorporated in the required introduction onto HERO.
